Summer Tax

Summer tax statements are payable through August 31, 2022 without interest/penalty. Preferred method to pay will continue to be the U.S. Postal Service using the envelope provided with your bill or the drop box located in the Police Department lobby entrance. If utilizing the drop box in the Police Department and you would like a receipt, please enclose the bottom portion of the bill and it will be stamped paid and mailed back to you. City Hall is open and staff is also available to assist you with your needs via telephone at (248) 624-0885 or email at finance@wixomgov.org. The Finance Department office hours are Monday -Thursday 7:15 a.m.–5:30 p.m. unless affected by a holiday. The reverse side of your Summer 2022 tax bill contains useful information such as payment options, 24 hour tax information access and due date information.

Garage Sales



Just a reminder, a permit is required to have a garage sale in the City. During a twelve-month period the first and second application for a sale at a particular location requires no fee. The fee for the third application is \$10.00 and the fee for the fourth application is \$20.00. No more than four sales are permitted during any twelve-month period. Simple Recycling will also be on site to accept clothing, accessories and small household items (please keep these items separate from the hazardous waste, electronics and paper shredding). 2022 Siren Testing

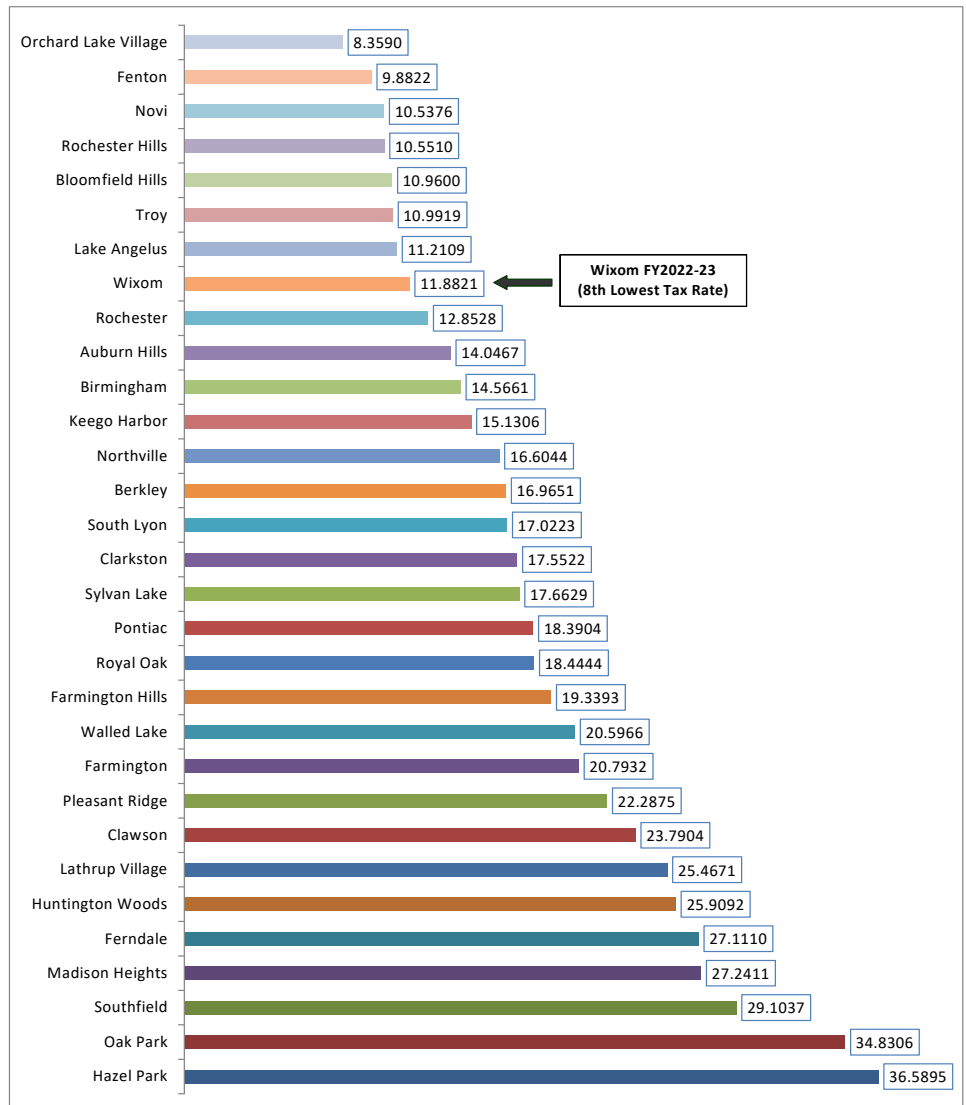
*All siren tests occur at 1 PM and occur on a Saturday except the one on March 23, which is a special test for Severe Weather Awareness Week.

Local Unit Tax Rate

The chart to the right compares the apportionment of Local City tax rates in Oakland County per \$1000 of taxable value. The City of Wixom is shown as the 8th lowest tax rate out of 30 units listed.

Below is a comparison chart showing the 2022 City millage rates compared to 2021. The total 2022 millage for the City is 11.8821 and the separately voted Library millage is 1.0666. The millages decreased from those levied in 2021.

General Operating millage is utilized for the operation of Police, Fire, DPW and other administrative departments. The Local Road Program and Bike Path millages fund related improvement projects throughout the City.
